Mission

- INGAA Foundation = Research arm of INGAA;
- Advance use of natural gas for benefit of environment and consuming public; and
- Facilitate efficient construction and safe, reliable operation of the North American natural gas pipeline system.

- Enhances public's perception of NG pipelines as:
 - safe,
 - reliable, and
 - environmentally preferred form of energy transportation;
- Develop data to support INGAA's influence of legislation and regulation at the national and state levels;

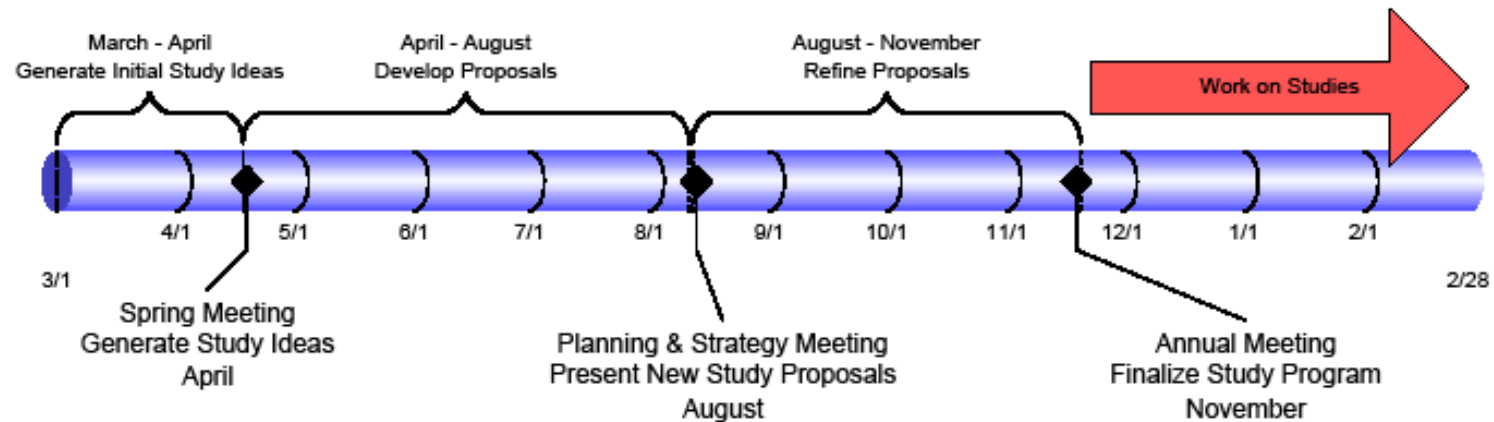

- The Planning and Studies Committee develops and executes the Foundation study program by:
 - Examining potential study topics;
 - Developing detailed study proposals;
 - Encouraging study sponsorship;
 - Serving on steering committees; and
 - Presenting completed studies.

STUDY PROCESS TIMELINE



NOTE: In most instances, proposed studies must be submitted for review in advance of the August Planning & Strategy Meeting. Proponents of studies outside of this timeline bear a high burden for moving forward.

Study Selection Criteria

- Is work compatible with our Mission and Objectives?
- Is interest in this work by members sufficiently broad?
- Is this new information?
- Is the timeline for benefits reasonable?
- What will we do differently as a result of this project?
- Is the Foundation the right to perform this work?
- Is the cost of this project appropriate scale?
